## Scoring and interpretation

Each "true" response is scored as 1 point. However, items 1, 2, 4, 7, 12, 14, and 15 are to be reverse scored, meaning that "false" responses are the ones to be scored as 1 point.

Add up the total number of points. A higher total score on the CHAOS scale suggests a more chaotic home environment, while lower scores indicate a more organized and calm environment.
