Scoring and interpretation

Sum the score for each item equivalent to the value of their responses: 1 point for agree, 2 points for partially agree, and 3 points for do not agree.

Higher values indicate more gender-equitable beliefs. Items on each subscale are cumulatively summed. A total score combines the scores from the subscales. The cumulative sum can be continuous or categorized as low, medium, or high support of gender-equitable norms.

The four subscales include:

- Violence: Items 1-6
- Reproductive health and disease prevention: Items 7-11
- Sexuality: Items 12-19
- Domestic life and childcare: Items 20-24

The range of total scores is 24 to 72.

The range indicates:

- Low equity: 24-39 points
- Medium equity: 40 to 55 points
- High equity: 56 to 72 points
