<ol> <li>Position the patient in a long sitting position on an examination couch.</li> <li>Grasp the medial (inner) and lateral (outer) aspects of the patient's forefoot with one hand.</li> <li>Apply gentle pressure by squeezing these areas together.</li> <li>Use the other hand to palpate the tender area between the third and fourth toes where the neuroma is suspected.</li> <li>Note any pain responses or clicking sensations reported by the patient.</li> <li>Observe the patient for signs of discomfort or pain during the squeezing and palpation maneuvers.</li> </ol>
