## Scoring and interpretation

The Spousal Assault Risk Assessment Version 2 (SARA-V2) is a structured professional judgment tool designed to evaluate the risk of intimate partner violence (IPV) among adult males.

Each of the 20 items is scored on a 3-point ordinal scale:

- 0 (Absent): The risk factor is not present.
- 1 (Possibly or partially present): There is some indication that the risk factor may be present.
- 2 (Present): The risk factor is confirmed to be present.

The total score from the 20 items can range from 0 to 40, with higher scores indicating a greater likelihood of recidivism and more severe risk factors being present.
